Proverbs 20:1-15

<u>Wine</u> *is* a mocker, <u>strong</u> drink *is* raging: and whosoever is <u>deceived</u> thereby is not wise. The fear of a <u>king</u> *is* as the roaring of a <u>lion</u>: *whoso* provoketh him to <u>anger</u> sinneth *against* his own soul. *It is* an honour for a man to <u>cease</u> from <u>strife</u>: but every fool will be meddling. The <u>sluggard</u> will not plow by reason of the cold; *therefore* shall he beg in <u>harvest</u>, and *have* nothing. <u>Counsel</u> in the <u>heart</u> of man *is like* deep water; but a man of <u>understanding</u> will draw it out. Most men will proclaim every one his own goodness: but a <u>faithful</u> man who can find? The just *man* walketh in his <u>integrity</u>: his children *are* <u>blessed</u> after him. A king that sitteth in the throne of judgment scattereth away all <u>evil</u> with his eyes. Who can say, I have made my <u>heart</u> clean, I am <u>pure</u> from my sin? Divers weights, *and* divers measures, both of them *are* alike <u>abomination</u> to the <u>LORD</u>. Even a <u>child</u> is known by his doings, whether his work *be* pure, and whether *it be* <u>right</u>. The hearing ear, and the seeing eye, the LORD hath made even both of them. Love not <u>sleep</u>, lest thou come to <u>poverty</u>; open thine eyes, *and* thou shalt be satisfied with <u>bread</u>. *It is* naught, *it is* naught, saith the <u>buyer</u>: but when he is gone his way, then he boasteth. There is <u>gold</u>, and a multitude of <u>rubies</u>: but the lips of knowledge *are* a precious jewel.

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
